HIGHLIGHTS

- In April 2014, retail prices of most food commodities monitored in 12 markets across Nepal were relatively stable or showed a marginal increase due to the onset of the lean season of most crops.
- Overall inflation rate in April 2014 was 9.4 percent. The food and beverage group was higher at 12.3 percent as were several sub-groups: vegetables (21.5 percent), fruits (17.0 percent), meat and fish (13.9 percent) and cereal grains (11.3 percent).

NATIONAL MARKET DEVELOPMENT

Price

Retail prices of most food commodities monitored across the country in April 2014 were relatively stable or showed a marginal increase. On a month-on-month basis, retail prices of coarse rice and wheat flour increased by 0.2 and 0.4 percent respectively. Likewise, prices of broken lentil went up by 1.2 percent, while that of black gram remained stable. However, prices of red potato and chicken meat climbed by 3.3 and 2.3 percent respectively. The price of edible oils remained relatively stable. As compared to three months earlier, most prices showed an upward trend with the exception of red potato and soybean oil. Compared to the same period last year, prices showed mixed trends, with an upward trend of cereals, red potato, chicken meat and broken lentil, and a downward trend of black gram and edible oils.

Prices in regional markets showed similar trends as the national average, with the exception of the price of coarse rice in the Terai markets over the past one month.

Wholesale prices regularly monitored by FNCCI/AEC in the five large markets of Birtamod, Kathmandu, Butwal, Surkhet and Dhangadhi showed an upward trend over the past one month. In the Kalimati Fruits and Vegetables Market, the wholesale price of most monitored vegetables showed a high seasonal fluctuation: prices of cauliflower, arum, radish, spinach, cowpea and carrot increased by more than 20 percent due to a reduction in supply because of the onset of the lean season, while that of bitter gourd, pointed gourd, okra, tomato, birnjal, pumpkin and French bean went down by more than 11 percent over the past one month.

In April 2014, the overall consumer price index (CPI) released by Nepal Rastra Bank was 198.9, an increase of 1.0 percent month-on-month. The inflation rate, as measured by the year-on-year increase in the CPI, was 9.4 percent. The food and beverage group of the CPI was 238.1, an increase of 1.9 percent month-on-month, but an increase of 12.3 percent year-on-year; several sub-groups showed higher year-on-year increases: vegetables (21.5 percent), fruits (17.0 percent), meat and fish (13.9 percent), spices (11.6 percent) and cereal grains (11.3 percent). The non-food and services group of the CPI was 169.9, an increase of 0.2 percent month-on-month and 7.0 percent year-on-year.

Supply

The supply situation across the country is reported as normal due to smooth functioning of markets and transport services. However, NeKSAP district and cluster coordinators report that markets in the Hill and Mountain areas have started to stockpile food commodities in anticipation of the likely disruption of transportation and supply during the upcoming monsoon season, which is expected to start from 10 June.



Outlook


Most food prices are expected to rise in next month with the exception of recently harvested winter crops. Prices of summer vegetables are likely to decline in the coming months.

The preliminary estimates of winter crop production, mainly wheat, show a marginal increase compared to last year due to timely rainfall and availability of fertilizers. This will help to enhance the country's national food balance.
