HIGHLIGHTS

- High food prices have remained of significant concern for over 18 months. The recent year-on-year food price inflation figure provided by the Nepal Rastra Bank in October was 16.3 percent.
- Harvesting of the summer crop has generally improved market supply and will likely ease food prices in coming months. However, poor regional and domestic production, combined with increasing global demand, will likely push the price of grains up significantly by the beginning of 2010.
- The rising price of pulses and basic vegetables remains of serious concern, over the past 6 months a survey by WFP of almost 500 households revealed that 60 percent had switched to eating cheaper and often less nutritious foods.

NATIONAL MARKET DEVELOPMENTS

Price

- The price of food grains have generally remained stable across Nepal this month due to summer harvesting and the reopening of key roads following the end of monsoon. The national average price of coarse rice in October across surveyed markets was Npr 31 per kilo and for wheat Npr 33 per kilo. However, these prices are higher than the same period last year (up by 3 percent) and significantly higher than in prior years.
- Rising prices for pulses and basic vegetables remains of serious concern. In the past month alone, the national average price of musuro (broken lentil) has increased by Npr 5 per kilo (Npr 108 to Npr 113) and the national average price of potato has increased by Npr 4 (Npr 32 to Npr 36). Compared to 18 months ago, the price of blackgram and musuro have both increased by approximately Npr 26 per kilo –a 30 percent increase for blackgram and a 67 percent increase for musuro. The price of potato has increased by approximately Npr 25 per kilo or by 116 percent over the last 18 months.
- Faced with these price increases and poor household food production, Nepal's poorest families are switching to cheaper and less nutritious food as they can not afford to maintain their normal diet. A recent WFP survey of almost 500 households across 51 districts showed that in the last three months, on average 60 percent of households changed their eating habits to switch to cheaper and often less nutritious meals.

Supply

• The supply situation in food markets has been very bad in many hill and mountain districts over the past months due to poor crop production and monsoon damage to key transportation routes. During October the situation generally started to improve. However, various mountain and hill markets are still suffering from heavily depleted market stocks. Of mountain markets regularly surveyed by WFP, only 14 percent have sufficient supply of rice, 16 percent sufficient supply of maize and 33 percent sufficient supply of wheat. Mountain markets dependent upon the Karnali highway continue to be poorly supplied because of road damage from landslides in Dialekh and Kalikot that have yet to be repaired.


MARKET OUTLOOK


 Overall food grain availability should improve this month both at the household and market level as paddy and millet are harvested across much of the country. The most immediate concern to market supply and food prices is the likelihood of increased bandh activity during November. • Poor regional and domestic summer crop production, combined with increasing global demand, will likely push the price of grains up significantly by the beginning of 2010.
