HIGHLIGHTS

- National food price inflation remains of significant concern. Staple food prices, including those of coarse rice and wheat, rose over the past month. Nepal Rastra Bank's June 2010 data indicates year-on-year food price inflation is over 14 percent for staple commodities.
- In recent weeks many major supply roads and trails leading into hill and mountain areas have been obstructed by landslides caused by monsoon rain. The Karnali Highway is operational only to Kalikot. This has pushed prices up by 15- 20 percent in Jumla since mid August. Roads are also impaired by landslides in the districts of Khotang, Sankhuwasabha, Okhaldhunga, Bhojpur, and Taplejung.

NATIONAL MARKET DEVELOPMENTS

Price

The average price of staple food grains in Nepal has increased this month. In the markets regularly monitored by WFP and MoAC, the national average price of coarse rice in July was Npr 34 per kilo (compared to 33 last month); the average price of wheat was Npr 35 per kilo (compared to Npr 34 last month); and the average price of musuro (broken lentil) was Npr 109 per kilo (compared to Npr 105 last month). The average price of potato remained relatively stable at Npr 22. Price increases reflect a worsening supply situation due to impaired transportation routes (see supply section below) and may also reflect a reported tightening of trade across the Indian border (see below).

Rice prices in major consumer markets have increased by around Npr 5 per kilo compared to last month, and this is reportedly related to tighter border control of Indian exports to Nepal (the export of staple grains such as coarse rice and wheat is banned by India). The significant increase in price is of great concern to consumer groups and the Government. The Government of Nepal has reportedly stepped up efforts to import 25,000 mt of rice from India.

Year on year (y-o-y) food price inflation, as measured by the consumer price index, moderated to 11.3 percent in mid-June 2010 compared to 19 percent in the corresponding period last year. The moderation in inflation is primarily due to a better winter harvest this year compared to last. However, sustained double digit food price inflation is still concerning, particularly as food price increases are highest for staple food items such as grains and cereal products (14.1 percent inflation).

Supply

In recent weeks many major supply roads and trails leading into hill and mountain areas have become hindered due to landslides caused by monsoon rain. This situation is particularly bad in the Mid and Far West of Nepal. The Karnali Hwy to Jumla, the only major road that serves the remote districts of the Karnali, has been blocked since mid July. The road is operational up to Khidkijyula, a market area on the border of Dailekh and Kalikot districts. Roads are also obstructed in Khotang, Sankhuwasabha, Okhaldhunga, Bhojpur, and Taplejung districts. The market prices of key commodities have increased by 15-20 percent in Jumla since the beginning of August.

The syndicate transportation system has re-started in Nepal. The effect of this on transport prices is yet to be seen. There has been no major hike in transport rates following the most recent hike in diesel prices (of Npr 3). However, it is expected that fuel price increases will soon push up the price of goods transportation -this will come on top of already inflated monsoon prices.

Outlook

Grain prices are likely to continue to rise until the completion of the summer harvest (September for maize and November for paddy). The harvest is expected to be normal in most areas.


Pulse prices could decrease in coming months due to a bumper crop harvest in India and a reduction of pulse prices in India by as much as 44 percent in some markets.

In 2010, there has been a significant increase in international grain prices, the impact on Nepal will be closely monitored in coming months.
